



Notice to the Public and the Profession

The Prime Minister has announced that Monday, September 19th, will be a one-time holiday for the federal public service to coincide with the funeral for Queen Elizabeth II and the end of the official mourning period in Canada.

This means that the Tax Court of Canada and its offices will be closed on Monday, September 19.

The one-time holiday will also impact TCC hearing schedules, as follows:

- If a matter was scheduled to start and end on Monday, or if Monday was the final day of a continuing matter, the hearing will be rescheduled and will be given priority for rescheduling.
- If a matter was scheduled to be heard on Monday, September 19 and to continue for one or more days immediately afterwards, the matter's first day of hearing next week will be Tuesday, September 20 and the hearing will proceed for the remaining scheduled days. It will be at the presiding judge's discretion whether to continue a matter for hearing on Friday, September 23, should the hearing not be finished by the end of the day on Thursday, September 22.
- If a matter being heard between September 20 and 23 requires additional hearing time to be scheduled beyond September 23, the Registry will give priority to scheduling such time.
